The Who Cares? Scotland Road to Love 500 event is **NOT** a race.

The Event

The event is a 3-day drive from Inverness, following the North Coast 500 route anti-clockwise, finishing back in Inverness

Declaration

I understand that by participating in the Event I will be raising funds for Who Cares? Scotland and I agree to give all funds I raise in connection with the Event to Who Cares? Scotland. I understand that by failing to actively fundraise I may jeopardise my participation in the Event for future years. I wish to enter the Event and understand that I do so at my own risk and that Who Cares? Scotland will not accept liability for any injury, loss, damage or death that I may suffer as a result of my participation (other than where your injury is caused by Who Cares? Scotland, where we cannot limit our liability as explained below). I understand that my statutory rights remain unaffected. I hereby certify that the information I have provided relating to me and my emergency contact is correct to the best of my knowledge. I also confirm that I have read and understood the explanation in these Event Conditions and further explanation within the Who Cares? Scotland Privacy Notice regarding the ways in which my personal data will be processed.

Participation in the Event

By submitting a registration form, you agree to enter into the Event and abide by these Event Conditions and any instructions given to you by Who Cares? Scotland and its representatives.

In order to participate in the Event each participant is required to raise a minimum of £100 in donations for Who Cares? Scotland. None of your costs in participating in the Event should be deducted from the funds you raise in connection with the Event. For example, you require a car to participate in the event (please see more information below) and the cost of this car must not be deducted from the funds you raise, nor should your costs for food or accommodation.

Safety

Personal:

- You must have a full UK driving Licence if driving
- You must be insured to drive the car



- You must adhere to all speed limits on the route
- You must not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs (including prescribed drugs which are accompanied by a warning not to drive or operate machinery)
- You must be of sound health to drive (it is your responsibility to make this assessment, Who Cares? Scotland is not responsible for checking your health)
- There must be no reason for DVLA to prevent you from legally driving
- You must adhere to all legal road requirements including the use of seatbelts and non-use of mobile phones
- You must drive safely and courteously at all times

Vehicle

- Your vehicle must be purchased or valued at £500 or less
- Your vehicle must have a valid MOT for the duration of the Event
- Your vehicle must be insured for the duration of the Event
- Your vehicle must be safe to drive for the duration of the Event (it is your responsibility to make this assessment, Who Cares? Scotland is not responsible for checking your car's safety)
- Your vehicle must have a first aid kit and fire extinguisher available for use
- Your vehicle must have high visibility vests and road warning signs (e.g. warning triangles) available for use
- You are responsible for your car at all times during the Event, including removing your car from the road if it is damaged or broken down (for example, you must be able to have your car recovered or repaired)

Any breach of this condition shall render your entry void. If you are found to be in breach of these conditions, Who Cares? Scotland reserves the right to exclude you from participation in the Event and any future Events.

Closure or Early finish

Certain parts of the Event route may need to be closed for health and safety reasons dependent on weather or road closures. Participants who decide to continue against instructions, do so at their own risk.

Who Cares? Scotland accepts no liability for your person, personal belongings or any features of the vehicle for the duration of the event (other than as explained below).

You are responsible for yourself, your car and your passengers at all time.

Cancellation by us

Who Cares? Scotland may cancel the Event if circumstances beyond our reasonable control arise, including, without limitation, war, civil or political unrest, terrorism, inclement weather conditions or any other unforeseen circumstances. In such circumstances Who Cares? Scotland will, if practicable, provide written notice of cancellation to the address given by you. If written notice is not practicable due to the timescales involved, Who Cares? Scotland will use reasonable endeavors to provide other suitable methods of notice including e-mail, mobile phone, text message or public announcement over social media. In the event of cancellation of the Event, Who Cares? Scotland will have no responsibility

for any costs incurred by you or your passengers as a result of cancellation including any travel or accommodation costs.

Event ejection

Who Cares? Scotland is responsible for the Event and for that reason has the right to refuse entry to the Event or to ask you to cease participation for any reason and at any time.

For example (but our rights are not limited to these circumstances) we may refuse entry to you or any of your passengers or ask them to stop participating in the Event if:

- * you fail to follow instructions given by Event officials;
- * you attempt to participate in the Event in a manner that Who Cares? Scotland at its sole discretion considers:
 - * may cause injury to you or another participant;
 - * may damage or harm the environment;
 - * in our sole opinion is likely to cause offence;
 - * otherwise causes a risk or potential risk to the health and safety of the public, you or your passengers or any other participants;
- * you fail to arrive at the start location at the specified time;
- * you are unable to make sufficient progress in the Event to allow you to complete the Event in line with timelines set by Event officials;
- * in Who Cares? Scotland's sole opinion your car is not fit to be used in the Event; or
- * in Who Cares? Scotland's sole opinion you are unfit to participate in the Event because of the consumption or use of alcohol or drugs or an injury or illness.

Images

The Event may be televised, filmed and/or otherwise recorded and photographs may be taken throughout, all of which may capture your participation in the Event. These photographs and recordings may be used by us in marketing materials for Who Cares? Scotland, to raise awareness of our work and the charity sector and in publicising the Event and future events we run or in which we are involved.

If any of these photographs or recordings contain your personal data, this is processed as explained here and on the legal basis of our legitimate interests in promoting the Event and our work. You have been made fully aware that there may be photographs and recording at the Event and how these will be used. If you do not want your photograph to be taken or to be included in any recordings please let us know as soon as possible.

Any photographic, audio, visual, or audio-visual recordings that you make of the Event or any part of it can only be used for your personal use and cannot be used for any commercial purpose. Please respect the privacy of other participants in the Event when taking photographs or making records.

Liability

Nothing in these Event Conditions shall affect Who Cares? Scotland's liability for: death or personal injury arising as a consequence of our negligence; for fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation; or any other liability which cannot be excluded or limited by law. These are liabilities we are responsible for by law but other than those already set out, Who Cares? Scotland will have no other liability to you whether for breach of contract, delict (including negligence) or otherwise, under or in connection with these Event Conditions or your participation in the Event. In particular, Who Cares? Scotland shall have no responsibility for any: * loss or damage * loss of profit * loss of reputation * loss of business, revenue or goodwill * loss of anticipated savings * pledges made on your behalf or by you to charity * consequential or indirect loss or damage, regardless of whether the loss or damage: (a) would arise in the ordinary course of events; (b) is reasonably foreseeable; or (c) is in our contemplation when you sign up to the Event.

Conduct

Who Cares? Scotland respectfully asks all participants along with their supporters not to use aggressive or abusive language towards our organisers, marshals, officials and volunteers. Who Cares? Scotland respectfully asks all participants along with their supporters to be respectful of local residents and other motorists whilst out on the route and not to drive aggressively. Who Cares? Scotland respectfully asks all participants and their supporters to use the litter and recycling facilities available within the venues and around the route. Please respect the communities you are driving through and do not drop litter but carry it with you until you can dispose of it responsibly. Who Cares? Scotland reserves the right to ask participants to leave the Event if they do not adhere to these rules of conduct or act in any way which is Who Cares? Scotland thinks prejudices the reputation and safety of the Event, Who Cares? Scotland, any member of the public or any other participant.

Medical information

You are responsible for your own health, including any medical condition. If you are in doubt about your ability to take part in the Event or if you have any medical condition which could place you at risk when taking part in the Event or you have any concerns about your health you must consult your doctor prior to commencing the Event and obtain their approval. Who Cares? Scotland does not accept any liability for the health of any participant.

First aid volunteers will be available at the Event but you are still responsible for your own health and wellbeing and if you experience any adverse health you must contact the emergency services or health services in the usual way.

Who Cares? Scotland takes reasonable steps to minimise the risk of injury to participants during fundraising events and has undertaken risk assessments in relation to the Event. However, by taking part in this Event, you acknowledge and agree that there may be conditions or circumstances beyond Who Cares? Scotland's control that can lead to risks to your health and safety. If you have any concerns or queries please contact Who Cares? Scotland at fundraising@whocaresScotland.org before agreeing

to take part in this Event. Who Cares? Scotland reserves the right to refuse entry into the Event if for whatever reason it considers that a person is unfit to take part.

Spectators

Any person spectating at the Event does so entirely at their own risk and Who Cares? Scotland shall not be liable for any injury or loss that might occur as a result of their attendance other than where such injury or loss is as a result of Who Cares? Scotland's negligence. Spectators are not permitted to drive the route of the Event with participants. All participants must be registered and agree to these terms and conditions.

Code of Conduct

We're all in this for one main purpose, to participate, raise awareness and fundraise for Who Cares? Scotland. We ask participants to adhere to a very simple principle - to behave in an appropriate manner and to treat fellow participants, volunteers, staff and the general public with respect. Whether physically participating or on social media, any offensive, abusive to threatening behaviour, acts of aggression or violence, intentional damage and general nuisance will not be tolerated and may result in you being removed from the Event or your registration being cancelled for a future event. If necessary, we will notify and provide evidence to the police. On social media, repeated criticism of the Event that may damage our reputation or the reputation of any of the other participants or the Event itself will be removed and the persons involved may be blocked and their registration for future events cancelled.

Who Cares? Scotland Privacy Policy

For the purposes of managing your registration for the Event, our records of the Event and in order to collect and process your donations and fundraising we need to collect basic information about you, including your name, contact details, details of your car and potentially your bank details depending on the way in which you send us the funds you have raised. We will use your information for the following legal bases:

- a) **contract** – for the purposes of our agreement with you regarding entry and participation in the Event;
- b) **legitimate interests** – for our legitimate interests in operating our charity and the Event (but only where these do not override your interests); and
- c) **legal obligation** – where we have legal obligation to use or retain data for example, for Gift Aid or accounting purposes.

Who Cares? Scotland, are committed to protecting and respecting your privacy. Information held and processed by Who Cares? Scotland (including the information we collect from you in connection with this Event) is held and used in accordance with the requirements of GDPR and our Privacy Notice.
